solutions can be created.

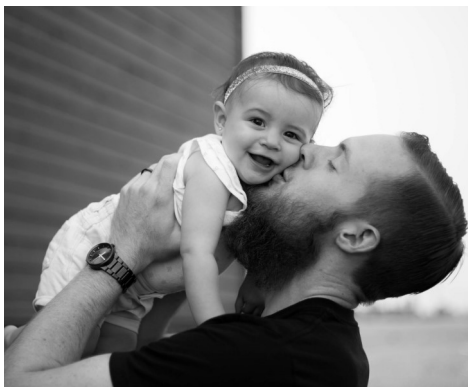
Just recently I have noticed in the media, in

RUDE.

hurtful and they do it once, that's **MEAN**.

When someone says or does something *intentionally*
hurtful and they *keep doing it* even when you tell
them to stop or show them that you're upset - that's
BULLYING.
