

Duffy Books in Homes Role Model Assembly

All of our students had the pleasure of meeting Mrs Diana Queenin.

Mrs Diana Queenin is affectionately known by Duffy schools as 'the Fossil Lady.

Mrs Queenin has travelled the world. She has lived for extended periods of time in Melbourne, New York and Los Angeles (as well as Auckland and Wellington).

While in New York she worked as a guide in the Museum of Natural History specialising in Dinosaurs and Ocean Life.

A highlight of Mrs Queenin's career was attending the opening of Te Maori at the Metropolitan Museum of Art when the exhibition went to New York.

In Los Angeles she attended UCLA University and studied Bio Geography (the effect of nature on the land) and spent time in the American deserts among the cactus and snakes.

Mrs Queenin is a certified Scuba Diver and has dived in the Caribbean, the Red Sea, and Thailand and learned much about the underwater world. She joined Project Jonah on her return to New Zealand and is very interested in Whales and Dolphins (as well as monarch butterflies, plants, fishing, insects, birds, and reading lots of books!).
