AROUND THE SCHOOL

FIRE, EARTHQUAKE and LOCKDOWN DRILLS

As a part of our school health and safety procedures we conduct emergency response drills for fire, earthquake and a lock down.

The purpose of practising these procedures is to ensure we are all as prepared as we could be in the event of an evacuation or lockdown.

For your information the lockdown of the school will be implemented anytime students need to be contained and protected inside school buildings, so not limited to but inclusive of for example;

- A chemical spill, which could put students and staff at risk of toxic inhalation if allowed outside.
- A person on the school site who could pose the risk of a hostage situation.
- An armed (posing an immediate threat to life, eg, with a gun, knife, explosive etc) or unarmed intruder inside the building.

LOCKDOWN ACTIVATION - Police may also request a lockdown as a result of a situation happening within the immediate environment of the school. The school has internal procedures to follow.

On Friday, in partnership with our local police officers we practiced our lockdown procedures. All went well.
