Dear Parents/Caregivers,


Your child's school report will come home today along with stationery details. Read the attached note carefully as you are able to order stationery packs online or pay for them at school over the last few days by cash or eftpos and have your stationery delivered free to school in 2020 if ordered by the 24th of January. A huge thanks to the Board of Trustees who will pay \$10 per child for their stationery pack if ordered via Office Products Depot. The prices are affordable and stationery is high quality. Also, parents/caregivers who have children who had low attendance (less than 80%: on average more than 1 day off a week) in 2019 will receive a letter with their child's report.

In regards to class/teacher placement, the process is a long one. We gather information and data from teachers and then create draft lists. These lists go back to teams to see what the combinations look like. We then tweak and rework lists until we have our final class placements. We think about children who work well together and those who don't. We think about having a range of abilities for literacy and numeracy along with a range of factors.

No doubt there will be children who have not got their best friend in their class or not got the teacher they would prefer. This happens! Apologies to the parents/caregivers who have made requests about their child's placement to myself or other teachers. We simply cannot accommodate all requests. We try to have children that are known to each other in each class and also look at the dynamics of particular placements with certain teachers and mix of children in the class. P.T.O

Reading over the holidays is a great way to keep your child's skills up over the school break!

We encourage you to be positive about the class/teacher placements with your children, they take their cue from you. If they don't have their best friend in their class or the teacher they really want, reassure them! Tell them that everything will be OK. Tell them they will still get to play and hang out with their friends. Our children test our reaction to news by gauging how they should react. We need to be the reassurance they need. So be positive, reassure them and show them that you are confident that they will have a good year.

Our class lists are final. Any request for change will be met with a "let's have a chat 6 weeks into Term 1". If you are desperately unhappy about the class placement do make a time to talk to any member of the senior leadership team.

I want to say a huge thank you to the students, whanau and staff of James Cook School who have made my first half year here an enjoyable one.

I look forward to leading the school forward in the years to come. There are amazing staff, students and families here and I look forward to continuing on the awesome legacy that is James Cook School. Wishing you all the best over the Christmas and New Year season.
