PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING:

LUNCH ORDERS FROM SOUTH END MINI MARKET: Beginning Thursday 13th February and every Thursday thereafter. Place lunch orders at the South End Mini Market on Wellington Road on Thursday mornings if you wish. No fizzy drinks. Flavoured milk allowed on Thursdays with lunches from the Mini Market.

SCHOOL HATS: These are compulsory from Monday 11th February while the weather is hot and sun is beaming strongly. These are available from Academy Apparel for \$15. Yellow hats will become compulsory in Term 4 but the old green ones can still be worn for this term as well. There are very limited 'old' spare hats in the office so it would be best to purchase your child/ren their own yellow James Cook School bucket hat as soon as possible.

SCHOOL POOL TO CLOSE: The Rangitikei District Council has issued water restrictions across Marton. Our school pool is not in a fully functioning condition and is leaking on a daily basis. Today we will be turning off the water flow into the pool to support the restrictions that are in place across town. The Board of Trustees will keep you posted on the much needed improvements to our school pool in due course. The junior classes will meet soon to plan an alternative to the swimming programme they were planning to run at our school pool over the first weeks of Term 1. The middle and seniors students will start their swimming programme at Marton Pool next week.

BIBLE IN SCHOOLS: The government has set out guidelines which now requires that schools must get permission from parents/caregivers for their child/ren to participate in weekly Bible in Schools lessons that will begin on Friday 14th February.
